We pray for the “long-haulers,” and we continue to lift up health care professionals and essential workers.
- We pray for caregivers and those they care for.
- We pray for our nation and our world as we experience the effects of the climate crisis. We pray especially for the poor, who are disproportionately affected by our inaction.
- We pray for immigrants and asylum seekers at our southern border, as well as undocumented people throughout the country, who continue to live in fear as our nation struggles to develop just and compassionate policies.

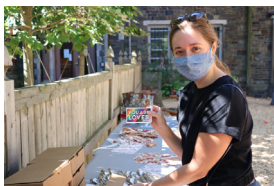
All Ages Welcome
