

First Church in Cambridge Creates Reparations Fund

On Monday, May 24, 2021, the Executive Council voted unanimously to approve the creation of a First Church Reparations Fund. The <u>measure</u> was brought before church leaders by members of the "Exploring Reparations" Faith & Life group, our Beloved Community group, and our Missions and Social Justice committee. In light of <u>our church's history of</u> <u>enslaving people</u> of African and Indigenous decent, <u>recent discussions about reparations</u>, and <u>focus groups</u> with members of local communities who have been



harmed by our actions, we feel called by the Spirit to take this first step of creating a fund to which individuals may contribute... <u>Read more</u>



Summer Book Group: *Sarah's Long Walk* Wednesdays, July 7 - August 18 7:00 - 8:15 p.m., via Zoom

The Christian Formation Committee invites you to a summer book group. Join Hilary Hopkins in reading and discussing, in leisurely fashion, Sarah's Long Walk: The Free Blacks of Boston and How Their Struggle for Equality Changed America by father and son Stephen

and Paul Kendrick. This lively, absorbing, and elegantly-written book is the story of school desegregation in Boston's early days. In 1847, Sarah, a Black five-year-old girl, was forced to walk past five white schools to get to her ramshackle Black school; her father sued the city of Boston. The legal struggle that followed culminated in 1954 with the historic decision Brown v. Board of Education.

We will read several chapters a week and then meet for an hour or so to discuss what we learned and our reactions, thus working our way through this fine book in six meetings. Feel free to eat supper and/or enjoy a beverage during our meetings!
