

- We pray for the 14 men who are finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter, and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding food and listening ears.
 We pray for all who are experiencing deprivation and hardship in these uncertain times.
- We pray for all who are affected by the recent surge of COVID-19 diagnoses due to the Delta variant and the lower levels of vaccination in parts of the US and around the world. We pray for all who are awaiting vaccines, globally and locally, especially families with young children—


Plans for Regathering, Hybrid Style September Sundays, beginning at 9:45 a.m.

FALL AT FIRST CHURCH




First Worship on the Lawn September 12, 19, and 26 at 9:45 a.m.
