We celebrate with those experiencing long-awaited reunions as international borders begin to open.
- When we feel helpless and overwhelmed by the climate crisis, may God's abiding presence ground us in love and hope. We pray for the divine wisdom, strength and courage needed to ensure that local, national, and global reparation efforts distribute power equitably and protect the most vulnerable.
- We pray for the 14 men who are finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter, and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding food and listening ears. We pray for all who are experiencing deprivation and hardship in these uncertain times.




Advent Candle Sets and Wreath Rings Available for Pickup Today, 2:00 - 4:00 p.m., church lawn
