


Contemplative Prayer Sundays in Lent, 9:30 - 10:00 a.m., via Zoom



UCC AID APPEAL FOR UKRAINE



WE STAND WITH UKRAINE.

On February 24, the Russian military attacked Ukraine. In less than two weeks, more than 1,000,000 persons have already sought refuge outside of Ukraine, and even more have remained in the country, but have been displaced from their homes.

The humanitarian crisis is accelerating in Ukraine and in neighboring countries, as the violence escalates and the number of people on the move multiplies.

Please consider supporting the United Church of Christ Appeal to Aid Those Unable to Leave Ukraine.

The United Church of Christ (UCC) is appealing for support for refugees and for elderly and other vulnerable people who are displaced within Ukraine and unable to leave. As a member of the ACT Alliance, UCC support is being targeted to people most in need through humanitarian relief partners with a history of working in the region. Aid also is being extended through Hungarian Reformed Church Aid, the relief agency of the Reformed Church in Hungary. The UCC's long-term relationship with the Reformed Church in Hungary is held through the Europe and the Middle East Office of Global Ministries.

Gifts made to UCC Ukraine Relief Fund will provide shelter, food, and other care to war refugees and internally displaced people. It also will help refugees and asylum seekers from African, Middle Eastern and other countries who had sought refuge in Ukraine and now are twice displaced, as well as other citizens of more than 125 countries living in Ukraine.

Uniting in prayer, action, and giving, we stand as a people of faith in love and compassion with the people of Ukraine and all who are affected, and with our global partners who are welcoming those driven from their homes.

A letter from Music Director Peter Sykes:

The three-manual, forty-stop Frobenius organ at First Church in Cambridge, made in Copenhagen in 1972, the first Danish organ imported to the United States, is about to mark the fiftieth anniversary of its installation and dedication.

In those fifty years, it has been part of the life of the church for countless services, weddings and funerals, has accompanied hundreds of concerts given by numerous performing organizations, and has provided another important service as a practice and teaching organ for generations of students; right now, it is being played on average about forty hours each week by students practicing and taking lessons. It is not too much to say that it has formed a musical foundation of all who come in contact with it. It's time, now, to thank it for its service by giving it a much-needed overhaul and tune-up....
