First Church Land Acknowledgment





LEARNING MORE ABOUT HANDEL'S MESSIAH



Today, as on Easters past, we joyfully sing out a beloved masterpiece that for many is synonymous with Easter celebration: the famous "Hallelujah Chorus" of Handel's Messigh.

This year, however, we do so with an awareness that this piece has a complex history. As we are learning, some scholars believe *Messiah* contains elements of anti-Jewish hostility. The "Hallelujah Chorus" has come under particular scrutiny, leading to symposia

and <u>media coverage</u> on the possible undertones of the piece, given where it falls in the oratorio. In the coming year, we will offer opportunities for teaching and learning about these matters.

Even as we sing out with joy today, we are committed to learning more and considering how we can hold a painful and complex legacy alongside our appreciation of artworks from the past.


Young Adults: Open Book Night Monday, April 18, 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. Home of Phil Jones


United Church of Christ (UCC) Appeal Tops \$1 Million to Help Ukrainians
