

- We pray for all who are facing severe, dangerous heat in the midwest and southwest and for all who are impacted by unprecedented flooding and wildfires.
- We pray for all those grieving the loss of 51 people in an apparent human smuggling operation found in San Antonio, Texas, this past week, and we pray for healing for those who have survived. We pray that lawmakers might see past their partisan differences to address the basic human rights of migrants seeking a new home.
- We pray for the people of southeast Afghanistan, who experienced a 5.9 magnitude earthquake that killed over 1,000 people and injured many more.
- We pray for all those impacted by recent mass shootings in Philadelphia, Uvalde, Tulsa, Buffalo, Houston, Milwaukee, and Orange County. We lift up those who are feeling lost and worried to live in their skin, to go to their grocery stores, their schools, their workplaces, and their houses of worship after witnessing these events. We pray for an end to this violence and the fear it instills.
- In the wake of the overturning of Roe v. Wade, we pray for those facing the loss of vital reproductive rights, and all those who care about them. We also pray for compassion, wisdom, grace, and courage, as the public discourse around abortion may cause each of us to wrestle with our own thoughts and feelings surrounding the complexities of this issue.
- We pray for the people of Ukraine and for people in war-torn areas around the world. We pray for all troops and civilians, and for bordering countries receiving refugees.

COMMUNITY PRAYERS

- We pray for all who are affected by COVID-19—those experiencing symptoms, those grieving the loss of loved ones, and those awaiting vaccines and boosters. We pray with and for anxious hearts, especially for educators, healthcare personnel, and other essential workers.
- We pray for all transgender and gender non-conforming people who are experiencing hostility, discrimination, and violence across the country, in connection with the increased number of legislative actions that negatively impact their civil rights.
- We pray for all creatures, all green growing beings, the stars and the beyonds beyond them—
 for we are all made in God's image. God, help us to treat your creation with the awe and
 reverence it is due, and to protect it as holy.
- We pray for the 14 men who are finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter, and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding food and listening ears. We pray for all who are experiencing deprivation and hardship in these uncertain times.


Summer Book Reading Groups



Remembering the Enslaved People of Brattle Street
Art Installation at Hooper-Lee-Nichols House
Sunday, July 17, 11:15 a.m., 159 Brattle St., Cambridge
First Church member and History Cambridge Executive
Director Marieke van Damme will lead a 15-minute walk from the church lawn to History Cambridge's headquarters at 159

Brattle Street to view the temporary outdoor art installation *Forgotten Souls of Tory Row:* Remembering the Enslaved People of Brattle Street. Marieke will offer a short overview of the project (outdoors) and also show folks around the first floor of the Hooper-Lee-Nichols House. Light refreshments will be served. Frobenius Restoration Underway

The first phase of our Frobenius organ restoration is already well underway! A small motor has been sent to Germany for repair. Pipes are being removed and cleaned, one pipe and one section at a time. This allows us to use the organ, albeit at limited capacity, even as the work is underway. You can see here what a difference the polishing makes; the left side is "before," and the right, "after."

We have good news, too, about our fundraising efforts to date. We are over halfway to our total goal of \$160,000! Thank you to First Church and to the wider community for "piping up" to support our "wondrous machine" and the beauty it creates.
