Where Are We Now?
Perspectives on the American Church
Sundays, October 9 & 16, 9:30 - 10:15 a.m.

Behind all of the headlines about religion in the United States and all of the threats of polarization and evidence of dwindling church membership, there are deeper stories to tell. Picking up from our summer read of Bill McKibben's memoir, *The Flag, the Cross and the Station*

Wagon, we will look at the big picture of what researchers have learned about the strengths and weaknesses of American church life and what they've concluded about the future of mainline Protestantism. We will think together about what it all means for First Church and how we relate to that bigger story. First Church Deacon Peggy Bendroth will lead our exploration and discussion. 

Art Showcase: Doors of Paradise

Sunday, September 25 Margaret Jewett Hall

See ten oil paint panels as one narrative, based on the bas-relief sculpture of Ghiberti, circa 1450. Those doors open to the San Giovanni Duomo baptistry in Florence, Italy. First Church member Henry Gates revives Christian art history to envision Biblical narrative in Genesis to Kings, exploring family and tribal dramas that may speak to our time and faith. We can imagine our matters of ethics—love, power and justice—that were at issue three thousand years ago.



First Church Land Acknowledgment
