



We pray for our country in the lasting wake of changing reproductive rights: for all those struggling through the moral and political complexities of pregnancy and childbearing, and for the integrity of our legal and judicial institutions at a time of extreme political polarization.
- We pray for the people of Ukraine as they experience increased attacks in an ongoing war, and for the Russian men drafted to continue the attacks.
- We pray for the 2022 United Nations Climate Conference (COP27) in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt, and for the divine wisdom and leadership needed to ensure that global reparation efforts distribute power equitably and protect the most vulnerable.
- We pray for all who are affected by COVID-19.
- We pray for the 14 men who are finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter, and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding food and listening ears.

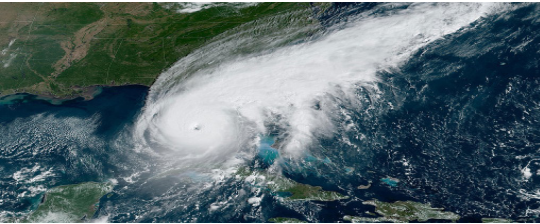




Pakistan Emergency Appeal

The situation in Pakistan is dire. This summer's monsoon season dropped nearly triple the average annual rainfall. Already, more than 33 million people have been affected and an estimated 6.4 million people will need humanitarian assistance. Nearly 1,500 people died as a result of the flooding. More than 1 million homes were severely damaged or completely destroyed. Over 17,500 schools were completely or partially damaged. The loss of livelihoods

through, for example, dead livestock and destroyed cropland is also staggering. The United Church of Christ is issuing an appeal to support immediate needs in Pakistan and the long-term recovery of those devastated by these floods. All donations will be deposited into the International Emergency fund designated for "Pakistan Response." Your generous financial support will be used by our partners in the areas of greatest need, for relief and long-term recovery.
