





### **COMMUNITY PRAYERS**

- We pray for Facilities Manager Lee Prouty's partner Phil, who is recovering from recent surgery and awaiting next steps for treatment.
- We pray for all who are in treatment for cancer: Anita Anger; Robin Williams, Kimel Williams's wife; Lyman Morrill, Ann Riker's brother; Judith Semmler, Alice Napoleon Jones's mother; Penny Kilburn, Nancy Kilburn's mother; Karen Anne Zee's daughter Becky Collet, and her sons-in-law, Denis Collet and Stewart Bailey; Beth and Polly, Ann McCann's sisters; and friend of Homeless Ministries Brian O'Donovan.
- We give thanks for strong voter turnout in our mid-term elections, for the protection of voting rights, for largely uncontested results, and for the endurance of our democracy in the face of political polarization, vitriol, and violence.
- On this Transgender Day of Remembrance 2022, we honor the memory of transgender people whose lives have been cut short in acts of transphobic violence.
- We pray for our Jewish siblings as antisemitic expression is on the rise in local communities, and as antisemitic rhetoric espoused by public figures continues to appear in social media.
- We pray for all those impacted by gun violence, and especially the community at the University of Virginia, the site of yet another school shooting, where three people died and others were injured.
- We pray for the people of Haiti, where water, food, and fuel shortages are leading to widespread protests, violence, and civil unrest.
- We pray for the people of Iran, especially women, as anti-government protests continue.
- We pray for the people of Pakistan, where recent devastating flooding has led to widespread loss of housing, food, and safe living conditions.
- We pray for those experiencing the loss of vital reproductive rights across the nation, and all those who care about them. We pray for our country in the lasting wake of changing reproductive rights: for all those struggling through the moral and political complexities of pregnancy and childbearing, and for the integrity of our legal and judicial institutions at a time of extreme political polarization.
- We pray for the people of Ukraine and stand in hope and solidarity as they continue to resist unjust and unlawful Russian invasions and retake occupied regions, even in the face of escalating violence. We pray for all soldiers and civilians in Ukraine, Russia and surrounding areas, and all global regions impacted by the violence of war.
- We pray for the 2022 United Nations Climate Conference (COP27) in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt, and for the divine wisdom and leadership needed to ensure that global reparation efforts distribute power equitably and protect the most vulnerable.
- We pray for all who are affected by COVID-19.
- We pray for the 14 men who are finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter, and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding food and listening ears.


