Reparations Conversations

Today and Sunday, June 11, 9:30 - 10:15 a.m.

Please join us for two conversations about First Church's journey thus far regarding reparations and where the Spirit may be leading us next. We'll talk about the communities most harmed by our history of church members enslaving in the congregation and our painful response to the work of abolition in previous centuries, as well as the living legacy of slavery in the forms of Jim Crow segregation, the war on drugs, redlining, and mass incarceration. We'll update the congregation on the Reparations Fund and the work of the Collective, which is convened by First Church member Karlene Griffiths Sekou. We'll also share information about efforts to engage in repair with the Indigenous communities most harmed by us—the Wabanaki, Massachusetts (Wampanoag and Nipmuc) peoples—and plans for learning & action opportunities in the Fall. We'll talk about the spiritual practice of reparations, guided in part by the book *Reparations: A Christian Call For Repentance and Repair*, which asks what Christians are called to do regarding white supremacy's cultural theft of truth, power, and wealth, and why our engagement matters. We'll reflect on how God is calling First Church to engage in this powerful and life-changing work.

During an early May 9:30 Adult Formation program, members of the First Church Archives Team offered a presentation about our First Church archives, which include sermons, records, and historical documents. A few date back to the 1630's; the most valuable are held at Harvard Libraries or in safety deposit boxes. We also hold items that have no connection with First Church's own history or record. At our June 25 Special Congregational Meeting, our Assets Research Team and Archives Team will jointly recommend the deaccessioning and sale of our non-First

Church related archival materials. EVENTS AND HAPPENINGS AT FIRST CHURCH

Highlights from Recent Executive Council Meetings

First Church's Executive Council (EC) consists of Church Officers (Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Associate Treasurer, Controller, Senior Minister and other called clergy), all members of the Board of Deacons, chairs of Standing and Gifts Discernment Committees, and a Member-at-Large. EC meets on the fourth Monday of each month (excepting July, August, and December), when they discuss and deliberate on a wide variety of issues related to church life. Here's a snapshot of what you could have "overheard" at the April and May EC meetings:

- Now that a large percentage of the congregation is meeting in person, the Deacons are working on ways to enrich healing ministries.
- Current Buildings & Grounds Committee projects include: exterior preservation of the tower and the northeast side of the Sanctuary, as well as a new safety rail for the Choir Loft.
- Council continued to deliberate about and affirmed a Debt Retirement appeal via a late spring letter that will be shared with the congregation.
- With support of the Mission & Social Justice Committee, several members of First Church have created a First Church team and are submitting an application to assist refugees through the US government's Welcome Corps program.
- Members of the Council-appointed assets research group, which includes members of our archives team, continue to research the status of our cockerel weathervane, our archival documents, and the parsonage.
- Council called for a June 25 special congregational meeting to approve the sale of non-First Church related archival materials.



Debt Retirement Appeal

In late May, First Church members received an invitation from church leaders to make a special contribution toward the long-term financial health of our community. Our goal is to raise \$450,000 over the next three years, an amount that will allow us to pay-off two major loans, one from our 2016 building renovations and the other for the 2020 installation of our energy efficient boilers. A successful appeal would restore approximately \$80,000 to our annual operating budget. This is one of several strategies the church is pursuing to set our church on a strong financial footing for the future. ***We hope you will give prayerful consideration to this effort and respond, if you are able, by June 30.*** Please know that any amount and level of participation helps, and we are so grateful for all of your ongoing financial support. Come Hell or High Water: The Battle for Turkey Creek Film Screening & Discussion

Come Hell or High Water: The Battle for Turkey Creek follows the painful, but inspiring journey of Derrick Christopher Evans, a Boston teacher who moves home to coastal Mississippi when the graves of his ancestors are bulldozed to make way for the sprawling city of Gulfport. Over a decade, Derrick and his neighbors stand up to corporations and politicians and face Hurricane Katrina and the BP oil disaster in their struggle for self-determination and justice.

Last fall, Derrick was an inaugural grant recipient of the [Bob Moses Fund for Education & Organizing](#), a partnership between Cambridge Community Foundation and the Moses Family. His experience building a movement offers lessons for Cambridge as we seek to further equity and justice in our own community. We're pleased to welcome Derrick alongside documentarian Leah Mahan for a screening of the one-hour documentary, followed by conversation with Dr. Janet Moses, Cambridge resident and long-time community builder. Juneteenth Sunday, June 18

Our Morning Worship on June 18 will lift up themes of freedom and liberation with a special focus on Juneteenth, which commemorates the abolition of slavery. The service will feature a “first look” at our emerging community fabric art project: ***Wade in the Water: Remembering and Honoring Enslaved Persons at First Church***. We will offer a public reading of names and a commemoration of all the enslaved persons associated with First Church over the years. Members of the Lloyd family— descendants of Tony, Cuba and Darby Vassal, who are listed in our records will be with us. Dan Smith and Egypt Lloyd will share in a reflection and time of blessing. Worship with us as we wade in the water together with generations of ancestors and descendants in this service of remembrance, repentance, relationship-building, and repair.

These events are presented in partnership with the Descendants of Tony and Cuba Vassall, History Cambridge, the Museum of African American History, Royall House and Slave Quarters, Slave Legacy History Coalition, Cambridge Black History Project, First Church in Cambridge, Christ Church Cambridge, and Black Coral, Inc.
