





#### **COMMUNITY PRAYERS**

- We pray for a warm and safe arrival for Nuro and Idle, two Somali refugees who will be welcomed to Cambridge by the First Church & Friends Welcome Corps Team in the coming days. We also pray for the team's volunteers as they partner with Nuro & Idle in these first weeks of transition.
- We pray for Andrea Seek and her family as they grieve the loss of Andrea's mother Lynda Soderquist, who died last Sunday morning.
- We pray for Marian Smith as she moves from her home in Arlington to a retirement community.
- We pray for Sexton George Williams, who is recovering from emergency eye surgery.
- We pray for Ginny Harlan's son Michael and his family, who live in Louisville, as Michael has been diagnosed with Mantle Cell Lymphoma.
- We pray for Krysia Burnham, who is recovering from hip surgery.
- We pray for Alice Kidder, who is recovering in a rehab facility after an extended hospital stay for various serious medical issues.
- We pray for Jennifer Petrallia, who is suffering from debilitating anxiety and depression.
- We pray for all who are in treatment for cancer and other ongoing health challenges: Carol Wilson-Braun, who is managing ALS; Jim Rae, Ami Brenner's father; Ellen Smith, Devin Hansen's aunt; Judith Semmler, Alice Napoleon Jones's mother; Karen Anne Zee's daughter Becky Collet and her son-in-law Stewart Bailey; Beth and Polly, Ann McCann's sisters.
- We pray for the many families seeking emergency shelter in cities and towns across Massachusetts.
- We pray for all those in Lewiston, ME, and the surrounding towns, as they continue to cope
  with their shared experience of a tragic mass shooting. We continue to pray and advocate for
  common sense national gun control legislation.
- We pray for workers who are unemployed, laid off, or displaced. We pray for immigrants waiting for work permits or desperate for work, and for union workers who are striking for better pay and working conditions.
- We continue to pray for all impacted by and recovering from recent natural and climate related disasters, most recently the hurricane in Mexico. We continue to pray for our rapidly warming planet and for redoubled efforts to reduce fossil fuel emissions.
- We pray for all those impacted by the violence of war and political upheaval, including in Ukraine, Sudan, and Haiti. As we prepare to welcome two refugees through the Welcome Corps, we pray for all political and climate refugees and migrants who make often lifethreatening border crossings over land and open water.
- We pray for the wellbeing and safety of our trans and gender non-conforming siblings as they face the impact of vitriolic public discourse and of state laws that restrict and criminalize transgender health care, personal expression, and wider LGBTQ+ education.

#### **COMMUNITY PRAYERS**

- We pray for those most affected by changes in reproductive rights: for all those struggling with the moral and political complexities of pregnancy and childbearing, and for patients and healthcare providers who are unable to give and receive care in their own states.
- We pray for the 14 men finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter; and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding resources and listening ears.

#### **Prayer for Israel and Palestine**

We pray for an end to the war and the heartwrenching violence in Israel and Palestine. We pray for all hostages and their families; for those living in daily fear for their and their loved ones' safety; and for all who are grieving the thousands of deaths of Israelis, Palestinians, and others in Israel, Gaza, and around the world, including members of our congregation who have close ties with people who are currently in the area.

We decry the horrifically violent Hamas attacks against Israel on October 7. We decry retaliation that involves violence against civilians, including deprivation of water, fuel, and food in Gaza. We pray for redoubled diplomatic efforts to address the escalating humanitarian crisis in Gaza and the ongoing occupation of Palestinian territories. We continue to pray for a just peace in Israel and Palestine and throughout the region. We also pray for Jews and Muslims, nearby and around the world, who are facing increased threats and acts of anti-Semitic and anti-Muslim discrimination, hatred, and violence.

We pray for ourselves, that we will be faithful, compassionate, and open to God's love and leading, and to all whom we encounter through these tension-filled times. Across whatever division or disagreement, may our words and deeds seek to honor the humanity and God-given dignity of every human being.







Call to Repair: Justice, Healing, and Reparations in Massachusetts Sunday, December 3, 2:00 - 4:00 p.m.

The Reparations Interfaith Coalition hosts a virtual Interfaith Reparations Gathering, bringing together organizations, communities and congregations across Massachusetts to learn and discuss how the reparations movement is progressing locally and how we can move it forward. National and local Black leaders in the reparations movement will speak to our shared sense that reparations are not a transaction but



rather a spiritual and ethical practice. This event is open to all those interested in building their understanding of and work towards reparations. We hope to leave you with action ideas for education, advocacy, and ways to make material reparations.

This is the first event among more to come from the Reparations Interfaith Coalition, a new, currently predominantly white, group of faith- and ethically-based communities dedicated to moving reparations forward in Massachusetts. This event is part of a national Sacred Reparative Season launched by the <u>Grassroots Reparations Campaign</u>.


O Come, O Come
