


Our Advent Banners

COMMUNITY PRAYERS

Prayer for Israel and Palestine

We give thanks for the recent pause in fighting and exchange of hostages, even as we pray now for further breakthroughs, ceasefires, a return of all hostages, and an end to the war and ongoing heartache in Israel and Palestine. We pray for all hostages and their families; for those living in daily fear for their and their loved ones' safety; and for all who are grieving the thousands of deaths of Palestinians, Israelis, and others in Israel, Gaza, and around the world, including members of our congregation who have close ties with people who are currently in the area.

We decry the horrifically violent Hamas attacks against Israel on October 7. We decry violence against civilians, including deprivation of basic needs for people living and being evacuated inside of Gaza. We pray for redoubled diplomatic efforts to address the already devastating humanitarian crisis in Gaza and the ongoing occupation of Palestinian territories. We continue to pray for a just peace in Palestine and Israel and throughout the region. We also pray for Jews and Muslims, nearby and around the world, who are facing increased threats and acts of anti-Semitic and anti-Muslim discrimination, hatred, and violence.

We continue to pray for ourselves, that we will be faithful, compassionate, and open to God's love and leading, and to all whom we encounter through these tension-filled times. Across whatever division or disagreement, may our words and deeds seek to honor the humanity and God-given dignity of every human being.



Join Churches for Middle East Peace (CMEP) "Stand in the G.A.P." response: Give, Act, and Pray

We are grieved by the war between Israel and Hamas. There is still work to do for peace and justice. We believe that, working together, justice can prevail. Peace is possible. Since October 7, CMEP has issued

many public statements and letters. CMEP Executive Director Rev. Dr. Mae Elise Cannon, who preached at First Church on October 15, has been making daily update videos, which <u>you can watch here</u> to stay updated on pressing news in Gaza, Israel, and the West Bank. - We pray for a warm and safe arrival for Nuro and Idle, two Somali refugees who will be welcomed to Cambridge by the First Church & Friends Welcome Corps Team soon after the New Year. We also pray for the team's volunteers as they anticipate these first weeks of transition.
- We pray for the safety and wellbeing of college campuses everywhere amid increased expressions of antisemitism and Islamophobia. We pray for campus and community leaders under pressure to address these challenging and complex realities.
- We pray for the many families seeking emergency shelter in cities and towns across Massachusetts.
- We continue to pray for all impacted by and recovering from recent natural and climaterelated disasters, including the earthquake in China. We pray for our rapidly warming planet and for redoubled efforts to reduce fossil fuel emissions.
- We pray for all those impacted by the violence of war and political upheaval, including in Ukraine, Sudan, and Haiti. As we prepare to welcome two refugees through the Welcome Corps, we pray for all political and climate refugees and migrants who make often lifethreatening border crossings over land and open water.
- We pray for the wellbeing and safety of our trans and gender non-conforming siblings as they face the impact of vitriolic public discourse and of state laws that restrict and criminalize transgender health care, personal expression, and wider LGBTQ+ education.
- We pray for those most affected by changes in reproductive rights: for all those struggling with the moral and political complexities of pregnancy and childbearing, and for patients and healthcare providers who are unable to give and receive care in their own states.

Under the dome in the chancel, we will rejoice in the sacrament of baptism and


Newcomers Meet & Greet and New Members Preparation Sunday, January 21, 12:15 - 12:45p.m. Hastings Common
