Epiphany Potluck and Service Saturday, January 6, 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. Margaret Jewett Hall and Sanctuary

Epiphany ("manifestation") is a Christian feast so ancient that it predates Christmas. We will begin with a potluck dinner, followed by a candlelight journey through the darkness until we arrive at the Sanctuary and circle it with light. Under the dome in the chancel, we will rejoice in the sacrament of baptism and renew our own baptismal

promises, ending with a joyful "sprinkling" of all present. This event is for all ages, so gather up friends, neighbors, kids, and come share the light!

Manifestation: An Epiphany Art Exhibit Saturday, January 6 in Margaret Jewett Hall

Epiphany is a pathway. The path is taken by the Magi. This path takes Jesus to his identity by baptism. We, too, follow a path throughout our church, beginning our Church year. This art by Henry Gates indicates the life path of seven stages. At each stage, there is a pause with God in rededication of our life. This art can be viewed during our Epiphany potluck supper.


